

AUTHOR RIGHTS : How do I reuse content?

My thesis or dissertation (main text and annexes) contains:

Short quotations

(± 10% of the document)

I check that the quotations are short and that the author and source are given

Published articles

Of which I am the author or co-author

I adapt my dissemination according to the publisher's rights and I request authorisation from the co-authors

Of which I am not the author

I request permission from the author and/or publisher

Photos

Of which I am the author

I make sure I have written authorisation from recognisable people, otherwise I blur the faces

Images, graphs, maps or figures of which I am not the author

In the public domain
(70 years after the author's death)

I check that I mentioned the author and source

With a licence
(ex : Creative Commons)

I check that I mentioned the author, source and the licence used

Neither public domain, nor with a licence ("copyrighted")**

I mention the author and source. For more than 20 images I request written authorisation from the author (see the educational exception)*

Personal data

I anonymise the data

*Warning: While it is possible to use a short quotation to reproduce a text written by a third party, you must be careful about including in your work images that you did not create. *The educational exception allows third-party works to be re-used in academic work, subject to certain conditions. The rules of use differ according to the nature of the work. **France applies "author rights" (droit d'auteur) rather than a copyright. Works are protected from the moment of their creation, whether or not the © symbol is used.*
